For us as Cenacle Sisters of the North American Province, we are into a new phase of growth. The retreat house on Fullerton has been sold and all of us have moved on to new addresses and the challenge of living out our charism in a different setting. There are nine of us living at Resurrection Village, which is across the street from Resurrection Hospital and not far from O'Hare International Airport. In my wildest imaginings, I never thought that I would end up living in an apartment. It has been a challenge.



So far, I have locked myself out no less that six times and am embarrassed to have to call for someone to come and unlock my door...again! Our washer and dryer set up is coin operated and until I got used to it I was ready to do the laundry but had no quarters to do so, having forgotten to get the change needed from the Bistro or from the front desk. I could go on and on...

During the past six months, I have come to realize that the beautiful chapel we had at the retreat house is gone as is everything else at that location. I still grieve but the reality is that God is no longer there for me... he is here at Resurrection Village. God is showing me how to live Cenacle charism in a new situation, how to process new experiences, how to treasure and relish all the new and wonderful people I am meeting and getting to know.

Most of you have found yourselves in similar circumstances: having to sell the family home, having to move because of a new job, illness or other situation. Whatever it is you and I face, let us remember that we have choices. We can dwell and wallow in past memories or we can do healthy grieving and move on to living each day to the best of our ability.

Let this new year be a time when we count our blessings and not our crosses, when we spread joy and not gloom. Wherever we live let us choose to be a positive presence to those around us...a positive presence to our troubled world. Amen! Alleluia!

On Becoming


Date: April 30, 2022 — 12:30 - 2:30 PM Central Time



Divesting of the Chicago Cenacle Retreat & Conference Center

Donating and repurposing our furnishings for worthy ministries

There are no unsacred places; only sacred places
— Wendell Berry (paraphrased)

Silent or directed retreats. Spiritual Direction. Outside groups or hosted meetings. Sunday Mass. While the Sisters arrived at 513 W. Fullerton in 1920, the building most associated with the Cenacle ministries in Chicago was built between 1966-1967. Hundreds of thousands of people entered this 88-bed retreat center. Many came to regard it as a sacred place. Sitting in the chapel as the bursting beams of early morning light would slant in through stained glass, one may have felt a holy presence. Walking in the courtyard could bring an inner stillness and serenity. Guest rooms facilitated silence and contemplation — in the midst of the city.

Because, "the earth is the Lord's and all it contains" (Ps. 24:1), we realize, of course, that every place is a sacred place, not just those locations that hold special places in our hearts or memories, including the home we just sold and vacated. What places like the Cenacle offered was a distinctive environment that served to awaken that reality more fully in us; a sacred place that pointed to the goodness of all of our lives and our *good* God.

We are pleased that that service continues in other spaces now, as we donated or repurposed thousands of furnishings and belongings. It was no small task to empty this 450,000 square foot space! Pews in the main chapel? Off to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Beds and bedding? Off to transitional housing for women, like Margaret's Village or other retreat Centers like Cabrini in Des Plaines or the Mission of Our Lady of the Angels on the West Side of Chicago. We are most grateful to the organizations (listed to the right) that received our gifts so that in one sense our retreat center, or at least its sacred mission, may live on, with them, and with those they serve. Special thanks to the Fenwick High School football team for their assistance in moving out hundreds of end tables, desks, lamps, and dinnerware.
